It is known from the date of an old furlough that Howell Parker, Sr. was in service on the coast of North Carolina October 23, 1781, when his oldest son, William, was born for he was given a leave of absence to come to his home near Lillesville, N. C.

Howell Parker, Sr. was defending Wilmington when the city was captured. The above birth and death records came from M. S. Parker's family Bible. M. S. Parker was the son of Howell's son William.

and will proceed and prove he was the father of Howell and Richard of Auson county. Our Howell Parker was a Chaplain in the Revolutionary War (Can you imagine a Parker having so much piety?), and at the Battle of Wilmington, in which he was a participant, threw down his Bible (showing another trait of the fiery temper of the Parker clan) and joined in the thickest of the fray.

When Howell came to Auson County, North Carolina, and settled, he brought with him his beautiful wife, Elizabeth Loftin, the daughter of Leonard Loftin of Bertie County, and here they both are buried. The heavy marble shaft still stands guard over their ashes and on this monument are the names of their sons and daughters, the cool accepted fact of their existence.

We have as a bases for our D. A. R. clause the data of Howell's defending his county at the Battle of Wilmington and proof that he joined the army of cavaliers that wrested our freedom and gave to America our Statue of Liberty another marble shaft other than our tomb stones.

So we take another step with other descending generations, sticking close to the paternal side of our antecedants, unto the 12th generations.

I pass on to Lewis W. Parker, born 11/13/1886; married 1/6/1908, Ina Applewhite, the daughter of Walter Applewhite and had issue:
